I enclose the very nice note from the Resident
Commissioner which came this afternoon, to be published with
the foreword & Preface.
I have also heard from Mr. Welles, and the result of his
letter is in the enclosed copy of a letter to Professors Cole or
Marwick of "African Studies"

Professor Cole is away till July, as I spoke to Professor
Marwick and the result of that is also in the letter
enclosed. He said too that if we sent an excerpt from my
manuscript to "African Studies" people would be
satisfied by just reading that and would not buy the book.
Whereas if I just wrote a note to "African Studies"
outlining the contents they would publish a note saying the
book is appearing shortly, and people would be on the
look out to buy it

I have the letters ready to post to Professors Cole and
Marwick and would like to send it off as soon as
possible after you have seen the enclosed copy of it. Therefore
to save time I send this air mail, and to save your time I
enclose an addressed post card, so that even if it crosses
a letter from you, I may know as soon as possible about
posting it. For I hope that in spite of delay waiting for
Captain Webb's last letter, that perhaps your letter with
the new estimates you kindly said you would send with
conditions of ~~sale~~ ^{sale} and answering the eleven points of
my letter of June 7th may perhaps be on its way, so

that after receiving it I can post my letter to
"African Studies" and they can publish their
proposed note. I am very much looking
forward to hearing from you.
